GLS delivered 926 million parcels globally and nearly tripled the number of lockers to over 20,000

Prague, 3 September 2025 – Parcel delivery company GLS delivered 926 million shipments globally in the last fiscal year. Alongside the growing number of shipments, the company also increased its revenues. GLS has nearly tripled the number of parcel lockers worldwide to over 20,000, and the number of pick-up points rose by 40% to 110,000. GLS, together with Royal Mail, is part of the IDS Group, which reported revenues exceeding £13 billion and returned to a profit of £278 million after previous losses.

International Distribution Services (IDS), which includes GLS and the UK's Royal Mail, increased revenues by 4.8% to £13.1 billion in the fiscal year ending 31 March 2025. The group's operating profit reached £278 million, recovering from a previous loss.

Both GLS and Royal Mail saw revenue growth. GLS reported revenues of £4.929 billion, up 1.3% year-on-year, while Royal Mail's revenues increased by 7%. GLS's operating profit reached £286 million, and Royal Mail returned to an adjusted profit of £12 million after a previous loss of £348 million. The majority owner of IDS since this year is EP Group, led by Daniel Křetínský.

In the last fiscal year, GLS continued its global expansion. The number of parcels delivered increased by 2% year-on-year to 926 million. GLS mainly expanded its distribution network, delivering to 110,000 pick-up points at the end of March, 40% more than the previous year. The number of parcel lockers nearly tripled over the year to 20,000 lockers.

"Under the ownership of EP Group, we will continue investing in the rapid expansion of our network of pick-up points and lockers to respond to the changing needs of customers worldwide," said IDS Group CEO Martin Seidenberg."
